4 **The Background**

5 Along with the regular business of our administrative sessions, members of the 2011 Florida Annual
6 Conference will have the responsibility of electing Lay and Clergy members who will serve as our
7 representatives to the 2012 General and Jurisdictional Conference Sessions. We will begin by electing
8 the 11 Lay and 11 Clergy members who will comprise our delegation to General Conference. Next, we
9 will elect the 11 Lay and 11 Clergy members who will join our General Conference delegates to comprise
10 our delegation to the Southeast Jurisdictional Conference. Finally, we will elect the 7 Lay and 7 Clergy
11 members who will make up the general Reserve Pool in the event an elected delegate is unable to fulfill
12 their responsibility.

14 The Florida Annual Conference has used a number of different approaches to electing delegates over
15 the years. During the last election cycle, an Optical Scanning System was used. Members filled in
16 “bubbles” on pre-printed ballot cards. These cards were then scanned by optical readers to arrive at the
17 results. Two of the major drawbacks to this system were: (1) the number of people required to operate
18 the equipment and verify the results; and (2) the length of time required to collect and count the ballots
19 and produce the visuals to display the results. It was a long and tedious process.

20
21 This year, the Elections Procedures Committee has voted to conduct our elections using a wireless
22 electronic voting system. Some of the criteria which led to this decision include:

- 23 • Speed – The results are compiled and verified in seconds.
- 24 • Simplicity – The handsets are clearly marked for ease of use.
- 25 • Functionality – The devices can be used for elections as well as simple yes/no decisions.
- 26 • Flexibility – We can easily modify the on-screen displays throughout the election process.
- 27 • Anonymity – All votes are cast in complete confidentiality.
- 28 • Reports – The system creates detailed records of the results of the election process.
- 29 • Personnel – The equipment technicians and operators are all that are required.

30 Using this electronic system, we anticipate a fast, reliable and trouble-free experience for all who will be
31 voting during the 2011 Annual Conference Session.

33 **The Technology**

34 We have contracted with a company called Options Technologies Interactive (OTI). OTI has had many
35 years of practical experience with Church and Business groups around the world utilizing their electronic
36 voting technology. Members will be using the new OptionFinder G3 keypad. These wireless handheld
37 devices have a number of features that members will appreciate as we move through the election
38 process. The on-screen indicators for battery levels, signal strength, and log-in status will assure the
39 user that their device is ready for every vote. Unlike other devices that we have used in the past, the
40 OptionFinder G3 keypad will not only make it easier for the members to cast their ballot, it will also
41 provide visual confirmation that their vote was recorded. You will not need to wonder or worry
42 whether your vote counted. You will know.

43
44 **The Registration Process**

45 Registration will occur by Districts as in years past. Once you have registered and have all of your
46 resources in hand, members will move to a designated area to collect their handheld devices. There will
47 be one set of tables with color-coded devices for Laity. There will be another set of tables with color-

1 coded devices for Clergy. Please proceed to the correct table to collect your device. You will be asked
2 to show your name tag to verify voting eligibility. You will then be issued one of the handheld devices.
3 The serial number will be recorded in the event of loss, damage, or malfunction. You will use the device
4 assigned to you throughout the entire Annual Conference Session. Please keep YOUR device in YOUR
5 possession at all times. At the conclusion of Annual Conference, the devices will be returned to various
6 collection points. The registration numbers will be checked to ensure that all devices have been
7 returned to the vendor.

8 9 **The Election Process**

10 The election process itself will take place in two parts. Since the Laity and Clergy are using devices that
11 are specific to each voting group, each ballot will need to be cast by group. During the time the Clergy
12 are voting, the Laity will be preparing for their next ballot. During the time the Laity are voting, the
13 Clergy will be preparing for their next ballot. This alternating process should not take long to complete.
14 You will be reminded to exercise patience and kindness during those moments when your particular
15 group is not voting.

16
17 Each ballot will consist of a series of votes. The Bishop will announce the number of persons you will
18 need to vote for on a particular ballot. By way of example, let us select the number five. You will first of
19 all need to identify the five persons you desire to vote for. The Bishop will then begin the voting
20 process. You will be instructed to enter the three digit code of your first selection. You will then be
21 instructed to enter the three digit code of your second selection. This process will be repeated until all
22 five numbers have been entered. The devices are not able to receive a string of votes all at one time.
23 They must be entered one-by-one according to the Bishop's instruction. When you have completed
24 your voting, the other group will begin their voting using the same procedure above. Though it may
25 sound complicated in print form, our voting segments should move along quickly in real time.

26
27 To familiarize ourselves with the use of the handsets, one or more "practice" votes will be held before
28 we actually begin the formal voting. This will give us, and the vendor, an immediate indication that the
29 system is functioning to specification and that the members have a clear understanding on how to use
30 the handsets.

31 32 **The Final Word**

33 I hope this brief overview has been of some value to you. Please review the biographies of those who
34 are seeking to represent you at General and/or Jurisdictional Conference. Nominee biographies can be
35 found on the Annual Conference web site and in your workbook. Spend time in prayer asking God to
36 provide clarity and insight as you identify those for whom you will cast your vote. I'll see you at Annual

Discontinuations

Local congregations are the primary strategy of the Annual Conference for reaching persons for Christ, discipling them and having a Kingdom impact on the communities of Florida. Over the last several years, we have learned about the five practices of fruitful congregations. The basic missional practices and expectations of every local congregation in “making disciples for the transformation of the world” are to:

- Cultivate a congregation capable of Passionate Worship;
- Extend the Radical Hospitality of God’s love to their community and the next generation;
- Form mature followers of Jesus through Intentional Discipling;
- Send out to the community Salty Servants in ministries of mercy and justice;
- And pour themselves out in Extravagant Generosity;

Congregations, like all human organizations, have life-cycles: birth, growth, maturity, decline and discontinuance. As an Annual Conference, we started eight (8) new congregations in 2010 and are projected to start nine (9) congregations in 2011. Thankfully, some declining congregations choose to go through cycles of transformation recapturing Christ’s vision for their congregation and returning to effective ministry to their community. As an Annual Conference, we must also recognize when congregations are no longer carrying out our basic missional practices, are not willing or able to enter into a cycle of transformation or are no longer financially viable. These are not decisions made casually. And we make these decisions fully acknowledging that many small congregations are healthy and have vital ministries in their community.

After study, deliberation and prayer by the local leaders of these congregations, districts and the members of the Cabinet, we bring you the following recommendations for discontinuation in accordance with ¶12548 of *The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church*:

- We do so celebrating the many ways people’s lives have been blessed by their ministries through the years.
- We do so with pastoral sensitivity for those still involved in the congregation.
- And we do so in support of the missional integrity and vitality of our Florida connection of congregations.

Report of the Committee on Standing Rules

Last year saw sweeping changes to the structure of our Annual Conference leadership. This year, there are fewer changes offered for your consideration. Below are the proposed changes we have to bring before you for adoption. There is the addition of a new task team on legislative actions. This team would seek to be the legislative and advocacy arm of the Annual Conference. The Council on Finance and Administration has also asked to add their “standing” resolutions to the Standing Rules so that they no longer have to be adopted every year. The remaining proposed changes are technical in nature and are offered to bring the Standing Rules in line with the ongoing practices of their respective Conference agencies. The Committee has reviewed and voted to move for your adoption the changes below:

1. **Creation of SR 405.2.f re: Legislative Action Committee.**

SR 405.2.f. would create a new task team called the Legislative Action Committee. The language creating this task team is as follows:

“Par. 405.2.f. General Conference Legislative Committee

- 1) Establishment. The Annual Conference establishes a General Conference Legislative Committee (GCLC).
- 2) Purpose. The purpose of the GCLC will be to study the legislation of the General Conference and legislative issues which may be considered by the General Conference in order to provide information and analysis to delegates to the General Conference and the members of the Annual Conference, and to propose petitions to the General Conference for adoption by the Annual Conference.
- 3) Membership. The committee will consist of eight members, clergy and lay. To secure experience and stability, the membership will be divided into four classes of two members; one class will be elected each year for a four-year term. To begin the process of rotation, on the first year one class will be elected for one year, one class for two years, one class for three years, one class for four years. The Conference Committee on Leadership will nominate members of the committee.
- 4) Responsibilities. The GCLC shall have the following responsibilities:
 - a) Study legislation of the General Conference and legislative issues which may be considered by the General Conference.
 - b) Present reports as necessary to be adopted by the Annual Conference containing its analysis of legislation of the General Conference and legislative issues which may be considered by the General Conference.
 - c) Propose petitions to the General Conference for adoption by the Annual Conference in accordance with Par. 507 of the Book of Discipline.
 - d) Offer assistance to the delegation to General Conference to provide information about the legislation of the General Conference and legislative issues which may be considered by the General Conference.”

1 **2. Amendment to SR 419 re: Conference Council on Finance and Administration**

2
3 SR 419 would be amended to add a section 5 that would codify the resolutions CF&A
4 asks the Annual Conference to approve, verbatim, every year thus no longer requiring
5 this action of the Annual Conference. Section 5 would read as follows:
6

7 “5. Policies of the Council.

- 8 a. **Mileage Allowance.** The mileage allowance for all persons traveling by
9 automobile for conference meetings is set at the IRS allowable business rate
10 plus tolls actually paid. Actual expenses for travel by other means will be
11 reimbursed up to, but not exceeding, the above mileage rate. Per diem
12 amounts will be set by the executive committee of the Council on Finance
13 and Administration (CF&A); in hardship situations the Chairperson of CF&A,
14 in consultation with the conference treasurer, may adjust these amounts.
15 Persons authorized to represent the conference in an official capacity in
16 meetings beyond conference bounds may be reimbursed for actual
17 expenses. Prior approval from the conference treasurer is required for
18 reimbursement. The group or person requesting approval must also indicate
19 which fund will be used for reimbursement. In keeping with the spirit of good
20 stewardship, expenses are to be kept to a minimum. To maximize resources
21 of both time and money, conference groups should meet only when
22 necessary to accomplish conference business. Whenever possible, groups are
23 also encouraged to schedule meetings in conjunction with other conference
24 events.
- 25 b. **Housing Allowances to Conference employees.** Housing allowances, when
26 provided to employees of conference institutions and groups, shall be based
27 on the prevailing rental rate in the area in which the staff member housing is
28 located. Professional staff occupying conference-owned parsonages are
29 responsible for stewardship of the parsonages in accordance with the Florida
30 Annual Conference Parsonage Guidelines as published in the 2008
31 Conference Journal and/or as amended.
- 32 c. **Fair Share Formula for Apportionments.** The fair share formula shall be used
33 to determine the local church apportionment for all conference and general
34 church budget areas. The fair share formula is based on the items as
35 reported in lines 53 through 62 of Table II of the most recent year-end
36 statistical report compiled by the conference statistician. These items include
37 Pastor & Associate Compensation, Deacon & Diaconal Compensation, Other
38 Staff Compensation, Current Expenses for Program, and Current Operating
39 Expenses. Compensation includes housing allowances and housing related
40 expenses paid to Pastors, Associates, Deacons, Diaconals, and other staff. In
41 reporting Operating Expenses, churches should not include payments made
42 to the conference for the conference’s ministry protection program for
43 property and casualty, workers compensation, or automobile insurance. Each
44 local church should include only those expenses of their “tuition based”
45 school actually paid by the local church. Expenses of the school, paid by

1 tuitions, are not to be included. The Florida Annual Conference recognizes
2 the importance of New Church Development and the role of the
3 Mother/Daughter relationship. Therefore the expenses of the Daughter
4 church, which are paid by the Mother church, should not be included in the
5 operating expenses of the Mother church for the purpose of computing
6 apportionments; such expenses are to be reported by the daughter church.
7 The total amount spent on these items in each local church is divided by the
8 total amount spent on these items for all conference churches. This
9 calculation determines each local church's fair share percentage or decimal.
10 This fair share decimal is then multiplied by the amount approved for each
11 area in the conference budget to determine the amount each local church is
12 asked to give. Each district shall ensure that the total amount apportioned to
13 the churches in that district is fully paid. Each district may decide how the
14 apportionments within the district will be shared by the churches in order to
15 achieve the 100 percent goal. Any Clergy Support apportionment and
16 Episcopal Fund apportionment not fully paid by a church shall be carried
17 forward to the next year and added to that church's apportionment.
18 Apportionments shall be given in full and on a timely basis. Local churches
19 are encouraged to give 10 percent of each apportionment item per month
20 during the first 10 months of the year.

- 21 d. District Work Fund Apportionment Formula. District Work Fund
22 apportionments shall be calculated using the same formula for all churches in
23 every district throughout the Conference, based on the compensation paid to
24 the church's pastor(s) and other appointed clergy. The Cabinet and CF&A
25 together shall establish an upper limit percentage to use in this formula so
26 that district-level mission, ministry and administration are adequately
27 funded, in keeping with the spirit of good stewardship, while taking into
28 consideration the individual districts needs and resources.
- 29 e. Not obligating Conference funds in excess of anticipated income. Except as
30 otherwise provided in these Standing Rules or in the Discipline, no agency,
31 individual or group may obligate conference funds in excess of anticipated
32 income. CF&A shall have authority to make amendments to a budget to
33 accommodate pressing needs but those amendments must be proposed to
34 CF&A for consideration and will be considered in the context of available
35 funds and other conference priorities. Funds will be available "On Ratio" as
36 received. See particularly Standing Rule 419.4.b, 419.4.c, 419.4.f, and 419.4.i.
- 37 f. Budget Submission Policies. Any board, agency or other entity seeking
38 funding in the conference budget shall submit their budget requests to the
39 conference treasurer not later than the tenth day of January for inclusion in
40 the budget to be presented to the Annual Conference that year. The CF&A
41 executive committee may grant reasonable extensions to the deadline. Any
42 entity that has designated or other funds available to them will provide that
43 information when submitting their budget requests. Each group's budget
44 request must be in the format and include the information requested by
45 CF&A. The budget request must include line item explanation of the amounts

1 requested and show the signature of the chairperson or secretary of the
2 group.

- 3 g. Line of Credit. The Council on Finance and Administration is authorized to
4 negotiate favorable rates for and to establish a loan or line of credit (secured
5 or unsecured) not to exceed \$1 million (\$1,000,000). In the event of a
6 financial shortfall this loan or line of credit would be used to manage cash
7 flow needs for operations of the Conference. Any use of this loan or line of
8 credit shall be reported to the Annual Conference upon its next meeting.
- 9 h. Empowerment to Act Between Sessions of Annual Conference. The Council
10 on Finance and Administration in consultation with the Bishop, is
11 empowered to act on financial matters between sessions of the Annual
12 Conference. Such actions shall be reported to the Annual Conference upon
13 its next meeting.
- 14 i. Executive Committee is Personnel Committee. The Executive Committee of
15 the Council on Finance and Administration shall be the Personnel Committee
16 of the Conference, and shall have authority to act on all personnel matters,
17 including, but not limited to matters concerning staff compensation,
18 employment, and other human resource matters. These decisions will be
19 made after careful study, research, evaluation and consultation with
20 appropriate experts, consultants and other resources available at the time.
- 21 j. Salaries for District Superintendents. The salaries for district superintendents
22 will fluctuate annually according to the percentage change in the Florida
23 Conference Average Compensation of clergy members, as calculated and
24 published by the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits.
25 Additionally, each district superintendent will be reimbursed for business
26 expenses, included business travel, at the IRS allowable business rate.”

27
28 **3. Amendment to SR 206.2.a re: Committee on Resolutions**

29
30 SR 206.2.a would be amended to provide clearer language for submission guidelines for
31 resolutions, and would read as follows:

- 32
33 “a. The Conference Secretary will publish guidelines for resolutions so that they are
34 submitted in Workbook-ready format. Resolutions will be submitted in
35 Workbook-ready format to the Conference Secretary, or the Secretary’s
36 designate, through U.S. mail, electronically, or any other reasonable means the
37 Conference Secretary determines.”

38
39 **4. Amendment to SR 405.2 re: Hispanic Ministry Team**

40
41 SR 405.2.c.4 would be amended to further clarify the membership of the Hispanic
42 Ministry Team, and would read as follows:

- 43
44 “4) Membership. The Conference Committee on Leadership will nominate five
45 members at large. The members at large will be leaders in Hispanic ministries within

1 the Annual Conference. The Committee on Leadership should work to achieve a
2 balance between laity and clergy, men and women. The Committee on Leadership will
3 also designate the chair of the Hispanic Ministry Team. The chair will be chosen from
4 one of the five members at large. Additionally, the following people will serve on the
5 Hispanic Ministry Team ex-officio (with voice but no vote): the Director of Connectional
6 Ministries, the Chair of the Hispanic Assembly, the Hispanic New Church Development
7 staff person, and the Hispanic Congregational Excellence staff person.”
8

9 **5. Technical Amendments**

10
11 The following amendments that are offered are technical in nature to correct
12 typographical errors and references to Conference Agencies and task teams no longer in
13 existence:

14 SR 405.2.b.3 would be amended to remove a reference to the Council on Ethnic
15 Diversity, which no longer exists:

16 “3) Membership. The members of CCOHM shall be all Haitian pastors, ordained,
17 licensed, and lay, serving in the Conference; all pastors serving a Haitian congregation in
18 the Conference; all district superintendents serving in the Conference who have
19 supervision over a Haitian congregation; the Conference Lay Leader, the chair of the
20 Conference Global Mission and Justice Committee; and all district delegates appointed
21 to the CCOHM according to its bylaws.”

22
23 SR 407.3 would be amended to remove a reference to the Council on Ethnic Diversity,
24 which no longer exists:

25 “3. Membership. The Committee will consist of a Chair elected by the Annual
26 Conference, the Executive Director of the Office of Congregational Excellence, the
27 chairperson of each District Congregational Excellence Team, ex-officio members as
28 described below, and five members-at-large from across the Conference with
29 experience in congregational excellence. Ex-officio members, all with vote, will be the
30 Chair of the Conference Commission on Equitable Compensation, the Executive Director
31 of New Church Development, and the directors of any ethnic church development
32 initiatives. Membership on the committee will be as inclusive as possible of clergy and
33 laity, men and women, as well as persons of various ethnic backgrounds. The Chair and
34 members will be nominated by the Conference Committee on Leadership and elected
35 by the Annual Conference.”

36
37 SR 406.2 would be amended to remove a reference to the Mission Ministry Team, which
38 no longer exists:

39 “2. Membership. The membership of the committee will be the Chair, elected by
40 the Annual Conference; the district Chairs of their representatives of the nine District
41 Committees on New Church Development; and nine persons selected from across the
42 Conference because of their expertise in new church development and to assure
43 balance in the committee membership. In addition, there will be the President of the
44 Florida United Methodist Foundation, Inc. with voice but not vote; the Executive

1 Director of New Church Development with voice but without vote; and the Director of
2 Hispanic New Church Development with voice but without vote. Additionally, the Office
3 of New Church Development will be under the leadership of the Executive Director of
4 New Church Development. The Director may be laity or clergy, and is named by the
5 Bishop, after consultation with the Cabinet, to serve for such a term as the Bishop will
6 determine. This person will be a member of the Extended Cabinet and receive the same
7 compensation and benefits as District Superintendents.”

8
9 SR 408.2 and 408.6 would be amended to delete references to the “third key priority” of
10 the Annual Conference as well as “the mission wheel”:

11 “2. Purpose. The Committee will be the steward of and promote global mission
12 throughout the conference. It will educate and promote the Conference mission
13 priorities and offer opportunities for mission, service, and action with local
14 congregations and ministries. Global Mission and Justice encompasses the
15 responsibilities of Global Ministries and Church and Society as defined by the
16 Discipline.”

17 “6.a. Emphasizing the relationship between and need for each of the following:
18 spiritual formation and disciplines, biblical and theological education, hospitality and
19 partnerships, and direct mission action and implementation;”

20
21 SR 409.1 would be amended to delete a reference to the UM Student Movement, which
22 no longer exists:

23 “1. Membership. The membership will be composed of 24 members, nominated on
24 the basis of their interest and expertise, taking into consideration, whenever possible,
25 concerns of inclusiveness and geographical representation, without diminishing the
26 effectiveness of the Board’s ability to carry out its mission, and elected by the Annual
27 Conference. The ex-officio members shall include the following representatives from
28 the colleges and campus ministry units for whom the board has responsibilities of
29 oversight and care: the presidents of the institutions of higher learning or their
30 designated representatives; college chaplains; and campus ministers/directors. Other
31 ex-officio members will be the Director of Connectional Ministries and the Executive
32 Director of Higher Education and Campus Ministry. The following will also be members
33 with voice and vote: two United Methodist students, a representative from the Cabinet;
34 and others designed by the Discipline.”

35
36 SR 416 would be amended to make its language clearer:

37 “**Par. 416 The Commission on Equitable Salaries** will be composed of between eight
38 and 16 members equally divided between laity and clergy and will include a member of
39 the Board of Ordained Ministry, one District Superintendent, one member of the Council
40 on Finance and Administration, one minister, and one lay person who is a member of a
41 church assisted by Minimum Salary Funds. The Executive Director of the Center for
42 Clergy Excellence and the Conference Treasurer will serve as ex-officio members.”

1 SR 421.3 would be amended to remove references to years that are no longer pertinent:
2 “3. Membership. The Committee will consist of eight members-at-large, who will be
3 placed in four classes of two persons each, and who will serve for four year terms. The
4 Committee will not be limited to, but must include, members with insurance, legal,
5 pastoral, and financial experience. The Conference Council on Finance and
6 Administration will appoint from among its membership one member with voice and
7 vote to this Committee. The Conference Trustees will appoint from among its
8 membership one member with voice and vote to this Committee. The Cabinet will
9 appoint one District Superintendent to this Committee. The Cabinet representative, the
10 Conference Chancellor, the Conference Treasurer, and the Conference Risk Manager will
11 serve as ex-officio members of the Committee. The Committee, at its discretion, may
12 invite others to serve as ex-officio advisors to the Committee.”

13
14 Should anyone have questions about the proposed changes to the Standing Rules, I invite you
15 to contact me at (239) 542-4051 or jtherrell@capecoralfirst.org. I will do my best to answer
16 your questions or at least refer you to the appropriate Conference leader who can better
17 explain why a committee/agency/board drafted the language they did. The Committee on
18 Standing Rules extends its appreciation to the many people who did not serve on the
19 committee, but helped achieve the end result. We especially thank Beth Fogle-Miller for her
20 hard work in reviewing the Standing Rules for outdated references. I extend my personal
21 thanks to my fellow committee members who give of their time and talent despite being very
22 busy people.

23
24 As always, the Standing Rules are a work that requires continual updating and attention. I
25 welcome your input as to any changes or suggestions you might have.

In 2010, hope was offered through these C.R.O.S. Ministries:

Ministry to Eliminate Hunger

- Community Food Pantries provided emergency food for 39,571 individuals. 43% of those served were children.
- The Caring Kitchen provided 84,464 meals
- After School Snack Program provided 28,230 snacks
- Cason UMC distributed 15,716 Brown Bag Weekend Lunches
- Gleaning Program harvested 218,272 lbs. of fresh produce and distributed it to 100 local non-profit agencies



Ministry to Support Children and Families

- 67 campers participated in overnight camps
- 113 children attended summer day camps
- 42 first-time commitments were made by children attending summer camp
- 112 volunteer camp counselors shared God's love and grew as disciples
