The Transformative Power of Resurrection

"Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. For I am the least of the apostles and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect", I Corinthians 15:7-9 (NIV)

Dear Friends -

I have been following some of you and your churches on Facebook during this Holy Week and have seen so many wonderful things you have done to celebrate Christ's upmost sacrifice and glorious resurrection which affirms the power of life over death, and how the power that brought Christ from the dead continues at work in the lives of many in our communities. I am very proud of you all!

During the past few days the Apostle Paul has been on my mind. He considered himself an eye-witness of the resurrection. His experience on the road to Damascus was such a powerful transformational experience in his life that he considered himself one of the living testimonies of the reality of the Risen Christ.

Re-reading the Bible passages where Paul recounts his conversion experience and connecting Paul with Wesley and his quest for "the faith that saves", I was reminded of my own need for continued renovation, transformation and resurrection. It is not just that I had an experience of conversion, of being brought from darkness to light. It is that I have had that experience multiple times during my Christian journey and still need that some more.

My first resurrection-type experience was at age 11 during a Youth Camp in August 1967, when I first was deeply moved by the Word of God and answered my first altar call ever. That day is marked in my calendar as the day when I first met the Living Christ and experienced the power of his resurrection.

Later on, I experience the power of the Risen Christ in December of 1977 when I heard God calling me to ministry and the power of the Holy Spirit had to do some real work on me before I accepted the challenge and surrendered unconditionally to God's purpose.

Once again I was deeply touched and empowered by the Resurrected Savior in October 1979 when I had a personal experience with the Holy Spirit that marked a before and after in my Christian life. I experienced at that time what John Wesley called "the second blessing".

Again I felt that power at work on me during my experience in the sugar cane fields from September 1980-August 1982. Only because of that power and that grace poured out on me was I able to endure and come out victorious from that experience.

And after that, I feel like I have needed a transformational experience in the power of the Christus Victor every time I was called to serve six different appointments in local churches in Cuba and two in the United States.

It has been said in psychological circles that a person needs to "re-invent" him/herself every certain number of years in order to get ready for higher endeavors. We preachers also like to use the image of the eagle, needing every 40 years or so to hide itself in a high mountain to experience a complete renewal of its feathers and even to repeatedly hit his beak on the rock until it comes out and a new one is born.

In Greek mythology there is the narrative of the Phoenix, a bird with colorful red, yellow and orange feathers, which dies every 500 years to come alive again from its ashes. Thus the expression: "reborn from its ashes, like the Phoenix".

All of that could be used as to affirm our spiritual need for continued renewal and transformation, particularly as we face the challenges of ministry in a broken world.

My suspicion is that so often we refer to our experiences of re-birth or resurrection as something pertaining to the past, just as I did a few minutes ago. We could easily refer to a moment of healing; an unexpected answer to prayer, a completely closed situation we were living in that only through divine intervention was opened and transformed by the power of God.

Could we testify of something really eye-opening and transforming that has happened recently in our lives? Has anyone been recently almost dying spiritually or even physically and only because of a miracle in his/her life was renewed and transformed?

When we are having difficulty to pray, when we feel spiritually dry and lacking inspiration for our preaching or vision for our next step in ministry, we would probably need the real power of the resurrection to operate in us in such away that we can testify like Paul did: "He (the Risen Christ) appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born".

By the grace of God, my friends, I am what I am. But I would do everything in my power for that grace to continue to bear fruit in me and through me.

As we celebrate Easter, let's ask God to intervene in our lives and bring new life to our dried out bones. Let's ask the Risen Christ to visit us like Paul on the road to Damascus, to give our lives new meaning and purpose. Let's invite the Holy Spirit to revive us again, filling us with that presence that will continue to empower us to be the leaders God has called us to be.

"A Million Reasons"—a year-long Florida Conference mission to pack 1,000,000 meals to fight hunger—will be launched at Annual Conference in June with a Stop Hunger Now meal-packaging event.

The goal during the AC event is to package 100,000 meals with volunteers on Wednesday and Thursday before the business sessions begin. "We will need many hands and feet of Jesus Christ to join in packaging meals to launch "A Million Reasons," Janet Kelley, administration assistant for the East Central District said. "We invite our AC members, local church groups and our youth groups to help make "A Million Reasons" happen." Information on how to sign up and details about the event will be available shortly, she added. Janet, along with our other district AAs are helping coordinate the event with our Bishop's wife, Pam Carter, and they are calling on us all to lend a hand to fight hunger.

"I can think of "A Million Reasons" to pack Stop Hunger meals this year," Pam Carter said. "And, here's my personal reason: a girl I met six years ago in Haiti wasn't getting a midday meal. Now she and the other

children who attend her school are served a daily meal because the school receives Stop Hunger Now shipments."

"For every one of us there is a personal reason to do something about hunger," she said. "Let's find a million reasons this year!"

On Saturday, March 9, more than thirty ladies gathered in the fellowship hall of East Naples United Methodist Church to turn pillow cases into dresses that will help give impoverished girls around the world a sense of identity and self worth.

"Dress A Girl Around the World" is a program of Hope 4 Kids International, a Christian organization dedicated to helping children around the globe. Shirley Thrasher, a seasonal attendee at East Naples UMC, brought the idea of "Dress a Girl" down from her church in Indiana. A group that included teenagers to Golden Agers, members of the church's Hispanic ministry, seasonal "snowbirds" and full-time Neapolitans got together for four hours on a Saturday to make the pillow case dresses that Hope 4 Kids advocates. Kris Clemmensen, the church's chair of Missions, and Elaine Thomas, the wife of Pastor Jim Thomas, aided Mrs. Thrasher in organizing and directing the women into an "assembly line" that produced more than thirty completed dresses that day, with another 120 in the "pipeline" to be completed.

A good time was had, relationships were made, and wonderful ministry was accomplished. A follow-up Sewing Saturday was set to finish dresses and many of the "snowbirds" planned to take the idea back to their churches up north.

God Works in Mysterious Ways

Just a few years ago I was sitting listening to a presentation given by two Cuban pastors. The question was asked, "Is there anyone here that would be interested in going to Cuba?" I do not know why or how but my arm shot up with the intensity and height that I had never felt. I still say today, "I did not raise my arm but it was standing tall in a room full of witnesses."

Nine months later I find myself standing in the Havana Airport scared but with determination as I approached the Cuban Customs officer's window. I had said many prayers and knew I was not alone but this is the real thing. I am in a Communist country that does not like Americans. Why would I put myself in this position? I knew God had something in mind for me but at this time I was not sure what it was. But I was determined that I was going to tell the Cuban people about Jesus Christ and what He had done in my life. Little did I know what was about to happen! I made it through customs without a hitch and was very thankful for that. I have not mentioned that my wife, Janet, was with me and she was not as "should I say, as enthusiastic" about this trip as I was.

God's transition started immediately as we attended church service after church service. Every church we went to was filled with brothers and sisters in Christ that held nothing back. They worshiped and prayed with the intensity I had never witnessed. They danced, sang, waved their arms, and cried with the emotions of the love for their Heavenly Father. It was infectious I could feel God's presence!

As we worked our way across Cuba to our sister church we could not believe what we had witnessed, but God had much more planned for us. We arrived in Alcala, our sister church, with much anticipation. We were not prepared for what we were about to see and experience. The people welcomed us with open arms. The pastor and his wife had two beautiful daughters, 8 and 9 years old, we immediately fell in love with them. They had "nothing" material but they gave us all they had, their love of Jesus Christ. We played, worshipped, sang, laughed at and with each other for three days. Now it was all drawing to a close and Pastor Alex asked me to speak at the church service on our last night together. I was honored to be part of the service.

The image is forever embedded in my mind; in a banana orchard with four poles and tin roof, dirt floor and one fluorescent light was their church. In this dimly lit location were sixty to seventy people, just days ago totally unknown to my wife and I, were gathered for worship. Now they are friends, true brothers and sisters. As I closed my message Pastor Alex and his family came forward with hugs of love and appreciation. In parting he asked the congregation to circle around us and they laid their hands on us. As the congregation crowded in just to touch us something happened. Never before had the presence of Jesus Christ been so dominate in a location, I know He was there, I could feel His presence. There is no doubt in my mind one of those hands was Jesus. As the tears rolled down my face I realized why I was in Cuba. It was not to teach the Cuban people about Jesus Christ, they knew about Him, it was to teach me. God had completed his transition. Yes, God works in mysterious ways.

I have returned to Cuba many times since that first trip. It is always with great anticipation of spending time with my brothers and sisters and our continued relationship through Jesus Christ.
